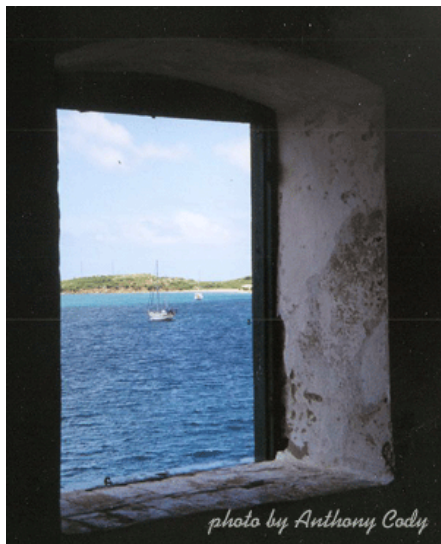


## Composition: Framing Your View

We have looked at the value of filling the frame with your subject, making your subject stand out, and placing your subject according to the rule of thirds. But you can try a variety of things that break these rules or shake things up.

**Assignment:** Take several pictures using some objects as a Frame. You could use a window, or any other object. Take your camera and try to shoot some framed views. Windows are one possibility, but you can also use the branches of a tree or any other object you can place in the foreground.



### Requirements:

1. Take several photos using different objects as a frame.
2. Download your images saving them to a subfolder named “framing” and move them to your main folder with your name on it.
3. In the framing folder, rename each image.
4. Print out your best example (Photoshop).
5. Sign and date in pencil using photographic format.
