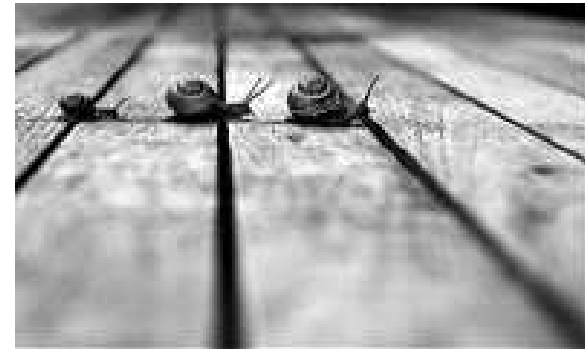


Composition: Rule of Odds



Rule of Odds

- According to the rule of odds, it is advisable to include an **odd number of subjects** in a photo.
- An odd number of elements is considered to make the image more interesting and aesthetically appealing to the human eye, while an even number adds symmetry to the image, which is often dull and looks unnatural.



Three

- The fact that implied **triangles** included in a photo will attract the viewer more than any other geometrical shape is connected with the rule of odds.
- Three objects in a shot are particularly good. Five, Seven or more can work but you run the risk of clutter.



Assignment:

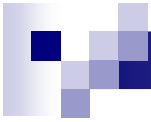
- Using the Rule of Odds, compose (10+) images using three subjects try to create implied triangles.
